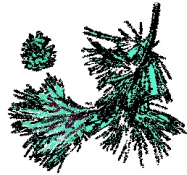
The book retails for \$14.95 and may be purchased from the Northern Wild Plant & Seed Cooperative or the Chippewa/ East Mackinac Conservation District .
